

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

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Introduction 7

Psychedelics have been widely used for thousands of years nearly everywhere on the planet. Psychoactive plants have been central to most ancient sacred rituals and primitive medical treatments. They have been worshipped in all cultures as "Plants of the Gods" and considered as mediators between human beings and the universe, linking the physical to the spiritual dimensions of existence.

In January 2006 the International Symposium "LSD – Problem Child and Wonder Drug" took place at the occasion of the 100th birthday of Dr. Albert Hofmann, the discoverer of LSD. Several thousand visitors and more than 200 media people from 37 countries gathered in Basel to hear speeches from scientists and historians, to exchange ideas and disseminate information. It was the biggest conference of its kind worldwide. For the first time since the turbulent 1960s, a wide range of psychedelic issues and topics has been brought back to public discussion and re-evaluation.

The World Psychedelic Forum will expand upon this renewed interest, presenting a unique opportunity for experts, researchers, and interested persons from all around the globe, to exchange views and hear presentations of the latest research on the value of these remarkable psychedelic substances in medicine, psychology, science, religion, culture and the arts.

The term "psychedelic" is derived from the Greek "psyche" (soul) and "delos" (manifest), and means a state in which the soul manifests itself. It was coined in 1956 by psychiatrist Humphry Osmond, in a now-famous exchange with writer Aldous Huxley; both recognized the potential of these compounds for self-awareness, and their correspondence to psychoactive plants held sacred for millennia.

Albert Hofmann experienced the extraordinary mental effects of LSD in the context of his work as a chemist in 1943. He so was placing a cornerstone for new insights and knowledge about by the time unexplored consciousness expanding substances. The following decade saw the publication of thousands of research papers about the nature and the effects of LSD, mescaline and psilocybin. But when LSD got out of the laboratories and "out of control", to be used for self-exploration by 1960s youth, Western governments generally declared psychoactive substances a menace, claimed it had no psychological, educational or therapeutic value, and linked it to dangerous and addictive narcotics. With a compliant mainstream media that

sensationalized and parroted the official drug policy, the "authorities" not only prohibited research on these sacred compounds but criminalized the users, a situation that has prevailed ever since, except for example in the Netherlands and in Switzerland. Inroads that have been made in recent years will be one of the many themes of this conference.

The classic psychedelics like LSD, psilocybin from magic mushrooms, mescaline from peyote and ayahuasca – the Amazonian "Vine of the Soul" – are not drugs in the traditional sense but belong, according to Albert Hofmann "concerning their chemical structure and their pharmacological effects, to the sacred substances, rediscovered through LSD, and used in ritual settings for thousands of years." They are characterized by the fact that they are neither toxic nor addictive, and have the power to bestow benefits of both practical and transcendental value.

The global youth movement, that peaked some forty years ago with the "Summer of Love", was fueled by psychedelics. A historical view shows, that the "consciousness-expanded" hippie counterculture exerted an enduring influence on society. Without the soul-opening and sensory stimulus of psychedelics, many of the social, cultural and ecological advances taken for granted today would be absent from our lives.

At the World Psychedelic Forum more than fifty experts, as well as thirty "rising researchers" from all over the world will bear witness to, and shine light upon the multidimensional psychedelic experience with its tremendous potential for expanding consciousness and for self-awareness. We will hear of the renewal of research that foretells a promising future when psychedelic plants and their synthetic derivatives will reclaim their destined position as incomparably valuable tools for individual and collective evolution and thus supporting the needed consciousness change for humanity.

Preface

Alienation from nature and the loss of the experience of being part of the living creation is the greatest tragedy of our materialistic era. It is the causative reason for ecological devastation and climate change.

Therefore I attribute absolute highest importance to consciousness change. I regard psychedelics as catalyzers for this. They are tools which are guiding our perception toward other deeper areas of our human existence, so that we again become aware of our spiritual essence. Psychedelic experiences in a safe setting can help our consciousness open up to this sensation of connection and of being one with nature.

LSD and related substances are not drugs in the usual sense, but are part of the sacred substances, which have been used for thousand of years in ritual settings. The classic psychedelics like LSD, psilocybin and mescaline are characterized by the fact that they are neither toxic nor addictive. It is my great request to separate psychedelics from the ongoing debates about drugs, and to highlight the tremendous potential inherent to these substances for self-awareness, as an adjunct in therapy, and for fundamental research into the human mind.

It is my wish that a modern Eleusis will emerge, in which seeking humans can learn to have transcendent experiences with sacred substances in a safe setting.

I am convinced that this conference furthers the idea that these soul-opening, mind-revealing substances will find their appropriate place in our society and our culture.

Program Flow

Each morning will begin with a **"Tune In"**, a meditative, musical start into the program.



The Roots of Human Violence and Greed: Observations from Psychedelic Research.

(English, simultaneous translation Eng/Ger)

Since time immemorial, violence and greed have been among the most important forces driving human history. Due to technological progress and exponential population growth in the twentieth century, they have become a threat for survival of life on our planet. It has become imperative to gain a deeper understanding of the roots of these forces

in the human psyche and to find ways of reducing their impact in the world.

In this lecture, we will explore the observations from psychedelic research that offer new insights into extreme forms of human violence and social pathology, such as wars, bloody revolutions, terrorism, suicide bombing, concentration camps, and genocide. In a series of slides, we will demonstrate the astonishing similarities between the symbolism of posters and cartoons from the time of wars and the visions accompanying the reliving of birth and the experience of psychospiritual death and rebirth.

Psychotropics Beyond Therapy:

The Enhancement of Humans and its Neuroethical Challenges in a (Brave) New World

(German, without translation)

With the advent of pharmaceutical neuroenhancements as Ritalin, Modafinil, Prozac and other "lifestyle" drugs, the non-therapeutical (ab-)use of psychotropics is reconsidered by ethic commissions, politicians and philosophers worldwide. In the near future, substance use might be common in everyday life in order to increase alertness and working efficiency or just to feel "better than well". Enthusiastically embraced as a step towards transhumanism by some, others fear the loss of authenticity, growing inequalities or political quietism in a world of mind-doping and synthetic happiness. Mapping the field in the current debate, some of the crucial ethical issues are explored in the hope to bridge the gap between theoretical discourse and the experiences of the psychedelic community, which have not (yet) been paid the attention they may deserve.

On the Bus in America:

Acid Tests, The Merry Pranksters, and the Grateful Dead (English, simultaneous translation Eng/Ger)

In 1965, a group of young writers and artists began a series of parties and happenings to explore the new regions of mind accessed with LSD. Named The Merry Pranksters, they created a new type of gathering where boundaries between audience and performers disappeared and all participated in a new consciousness. The term "psychedelic" was coined in 1956 by psychiatrist Humphry Osmond, in a now-famous exchange with writer Aldous Huxley, who both recognized the potential of these "new" kind of psychoactive substances for self-awareness and to expand consciousness, in an age of nuclear proliferation and Cold War confrontations.

But it was American exponents, like Harvard scholars Timothy Leary, Richard Alpert and Ralph Metzner, Beat poet Allen Ginsberg, novelist Ken Kesey and The Merry Pranksters, with their legendary Acid Tests, acid rock bands like The Grateful Dead, and underground LSD chemists exemplified by Owsley who, with other countercultural activists and artists, enabled a Psychedelic Revolution in the U.S. The youth movement, culminating at the "Summer of Love" in 1967, and perhaps best expressed by the slogans All You Need is Love and Make Love Not War, quickly spread to Western Europe and all over the world.

Contemporary witnesses recount the origins, expectations and experiences to describe this time of cultural, political, and social changes.

Daniel Pinchbeck will discuss his experiences taking iboga, a psychedelic rootbark inducing a trance that lasts for thirty hours, in an initiatory ceremony with the Bwiti tribe of Gabon, a small country on the equator in West Africa. The bark powder temporarily releases the soul from the body, allowing the initiate entry into the African spiritual cosmos, where he is shown the outline of his fate. Some of the Bwiti call the ceremony "breaking open the head;" Pinchbeck describes how his own head was broken open, and how he has gingerly attempted to put the pieces back together again. He will finally compare his experience to a second session with ibogaine in a clinic in Mexico.

Its power to convey visions, awareness, and wisdom, allowed indigenous people to develop a way to cohabitate, during which the healing of the social and cultural life, on a physical, mental, and spiritual level can take place permanently. The ancient, sacred tales and the ayahuasca rituals are closely connected with communal life. Nowadays, these sacred practices are shared with humans from other societies and cultures, thus receiving recovery, healing and insight, when previously, the use of ayahuasca had long been reserved to the native people. To share the knowledge and the healing properties with others is one of the most important teachings ayahuasca has been given to the natives, who initially have received it.

Theirs is an oral tradition, which they call the Tradition of Knowledge.

Explorations and opening up of consciousness require journeys to the edge of the world, hoping to find such characters to act as our allies, protectors, and mentors. And, of course, the physical journey is only a small part. Albert Hofmann not only greatly facilitated this process, he provided one of the few ways in these times, to cross to the other side.

Baba Rampuri entertains and enlightens us with accounts of his "bold journey which explores the true intersections of Eastern and Western thought," (Deepak Chopra) as he

became the first foreigner to be initiated into India's most ancient order of yogis and shamans, the Naga Sannyasis, and a guru with a number of disciples within the order.

A Journey Into The Heart of Shipibo Shamanism

Documentary, 75 Minutes, English

After a short introduction, the Dutch director will present his highly appraised documentary, leading us into the heart of Shipibo shamanism:

"Questembetsa is a Shipibo-Conibo Shaman, who enabled me to experience Shamanism from the inside. There are 45 000 Shipibo Conibos living together along the Amazon River in Peru. Questembetsa is the spiritual guide of all Shipibo Conibos. He is the Master Shaman who trains all of his people's Shamans. Questembetsa enabled us to film a summer solstice ceremony, which lasted for three days and three nights. This traditional celebration has never been recorded on film, and justly so. It has not occurred for 70 years and has obviously been seen by very few 'non-Indians.' Using night-vision cameras, we were able to immortalize these unique moments.

Under Questembetsa's protective watch, I participated in ceremonies and experienced what can be characterized as a 'near death experience.' For me, this was a powerful consciousness experience, where I crossed over, to the other side of the mirror. Once my initiation began, it would continue for over a year. Having experienced this journey of initiation and learning, I am now able to speak about Shamanism."

This documentary film will be the testimony of a personal and subjective adventure. It will also show the dangers and risks involved in shamanism: Losing yourself in the light or the darkness of your recently awakened emotions or misinterpreting the feelings or visions. This could lead to schizophrenia, in the event these journeys are not guided by competent shamans or compliant with an unyielding discipline and strict diet.

The film will primarily show the therapeutic power of the shamans and their plants. This power is a type of ancestral psychoanalysis or human psychotherapy backed by 4 000 years of experience and practice. The film allows the Shamans to speak for themselves. It shows how their cultures and their belief systems culminate from their knowledge of the Invisible.

Consciousness researcher, psychiatrist, and psychotherapist Stanislav Grof is one of the co-founders of Transpersonal Psychology, and he was president of the International Transpersonal Association (ITA) for many years. During his long-lasting work in the 1960s at the Psychiatric Research Institute in Prague he explored the effects of LSD for himself and with patients during thousands of therapeutic sessions. The findings and insights of this groundbreaking work lead him to design an expanded topography of the human consciousness. Stanislav Grof dedicated his life and work to the research of altered states of counsciousness. He received the "Vision 97" award granted by the Foundation of Dagmar and Vaclav Havel in Prague on October 5, 2007, for his outstanding pioneering research.

In this slide-illustrated seminar, Stanislav Grof will explore the process of psychospiritual death and rebirth, using the paintings from depth psychological work with psychedelic substances and holotropic breathwork. His artwork has been exhibited in museums and galleries worldwide and has appeared on album covers, on the cover of Newsweek, and on sheets of blotter acid. He lives in New York with his wife, the painter, Allyson Grey.

Visionary artists Alex and Allyson Grey teach painting and drawing from the wellspring of divine imagination, sometimes inspired by entheogens. 

Here you can meet numerous experts, partly active as speakers in the main program, partly as contributors specifically for this supporting program, among them:

Carolyn Garcia presents her Ten Deep Breath Gong Bong, an easy way to alter consciousness without substances, and other methods to improve mood and mental health.

Adele Getty, Cynthia Palmer, and other "SheShamans" will discuss "Past, Present and Future, and Passing the Torch", addressing psychedelics in terms of these questions: How did we get here, historically and personally, what role do psychedelics play now, and what is our responsibility to the future and the next generation.

Michael Horowitz, former co-director of the Fitz Hugh Ludlow Memorial Library, offers tours through the L.S.D. Library, sharing stories and anecdotes to single exhibits.

Therapist and modern mystic **Manuel Schoch** answers questions about meditative work with psychedelics.

Martin Schöne shifts between art and science, and he invites the visitors to encounter themselves, by the phenomenon of resonance, using his Brain-Avatar.

Wolf-Dieter Storl offers a walking-tour of healing plants and herbs growing within the immediate neighborhood of the Congress Center.

Daniel Sutter "DJ Electric" has collected and documented psychedelic music for more than 20 years. In various sets, he presents this style of music by means of background information and samples of tunes from his collection of over 1,500 records

Psychotherapist **Constanze Weigle** talks about the positive effects of psychedelics during pregnancy, childbirth, and lactation, and invites for an exchange of experiences.

Robin Wildt Hansen will read from L.S.Danielson's work Land of the Nucturnal Butterfly, describing the inner journey undertaken by a spiritual seeker with the help of psychedelic substances.

Michael J. Winkelman discusses ecumenical approaches and intentional community development as avenues to psychedelic freedom of religion.

From the "Forum" Film Program

Media artist **Peter-Conrad Beyer** presents From Eternity to Eternity – Contemporary Psychedelic Cinema from Germany, a selection of eight short films from various German film-makers from the years 2000 to 2007.

With Psychopticon Animatris II – A Continuing Tour of Altered States in Film, **Jon Hanna** presents the 2nd part of his unique collection of diverse clips from the 1930s through to the present showcases with hallucinatory content and inspiration in pop-culture animation. Whether induced by dreams, meditation, mental illness, alcohol, or other drugs, these psychedelic depictions of crossing liminal boundaries are frequently beautiful, often humorous, and always entertaining.

Ulrich Hennigs and **Holger Gerke** present "Mystic Transformations", a selection of their private psychedelic short films

Director **Ben De Loenen** presents his film Ibogaine – Rite of Passage, a revealing documentary about the use of Ibogaine for the treatment of addiction and its spiritual background.

Diana Reed Slattery's research concerns linguistic phenomena in the psychedelic sphere. She is showing Xenolinguistics, a video produced using LiveGlide, a 3-dimensional writing system for the visual language, Glide. This work is in collaboration with electronic composer, Stephan Moore.

Claude Steiner and **Nadia Honarchian** – trigger.ch – show their video animations, especially compiled for the World Psychedelic Forum.

Independent Closing Ceremony, 23 – 24 March 2008

The Psychedelic Experience is an instruction manual intended for the guiding of psychedelic sessions. It is based on the Tibetan Book of the Dead, describing the experiences of the consciousness after death, during the interval between death and rebirth, known as Bardo. It is possible to induce the Bardo state deliberately and intentionally with psychedelic substances

The ceremony aims to give an understanding of the psychedelic experience following the Bardo concept with a "Audio-Visual Trip Guide", projecting relevant text passages of the Tibetan manual, combined with animations of sacred geometry and carefully selected musical performances

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
